

COURSE DESCRIPTION

A number of new therapies for a variety of neurological diseases have been introduced over the last few years; many of these new therapies could be better adopted into neurology practices. Six common but challenging neurological diseases, to include Myasthenia Gravis, Neuro-Infectious Disease, Multiple Sclerosis, Movement Disorders, Traumatic Brain Injury, and Pediatric Neurology, will be discussed in the Symposium. Each of the topics covered have published evidence-based clinical practice guidelines through the American Academy of Neurology (AAN). This symposium, which features nationally recognized speakers noted for their expertise in these existing and new therapies, will provide neurologists the opportunity to update their clinical practice and learn more effective ways to treat their patients.

New Therapies in Traumatic Brain Injury

- 1. Review the American Academy of Neurology 2013 guidelines on sports concussions
- 2. Discuss clinical aspects of traumatic brain injury / concussion

New Therapies in Pediatric Neurology

- 1. Discuss use of anti-epileptics during pregnancy
- 2. Provide an update on management of adolescent epilepsy
