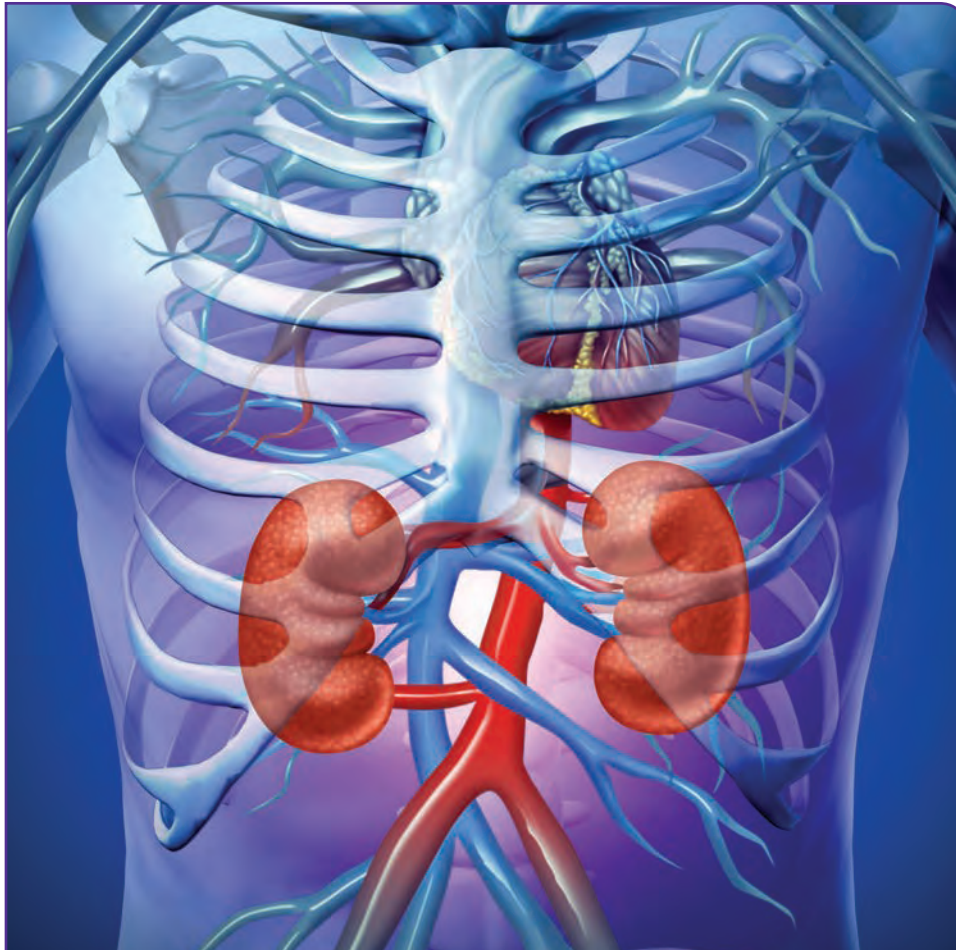

Kidney transplantation is the best option to restore quality of life for patients with end stage renal disease. In-center dialysis in particular, requires a huge time commitment from patients, who undergo treatment 3 times weekly for several hours each session. This conference is designed to educate dialysis unit nurses, social workers, technicians and nutritionists who work closely with dialysis patients to enable them to provide accurate information regarding renal transplantation from a clinical perspective but also socially and financially.
