
Otolaryngology for the Primary Care Provider

Target Audience

This one day course is designed for primary care physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants who work in general medicine, family practice and pediatrics with an interest in providing optimum care for patients with otolaryngologic conditions.

Educational Objectives

Through participation in this conference, the participants will have an opportunity to:

- Establish appropriate workup, diagnosis, initial treatment and referral practices for common Otolaryngology related disease processes
- Develop familiarity with Otolaryngology providers and resources available to primary care providers
- In-depth look at common conditions to include:
 - Head and Neck: evaluation of neck mass, Thyroid/Parathyroid evaluation/workup, OP Cancer/HPV
 - Laryngology: GERD vs sore throat, hoarseness, Dysphagia
 - **Otology**: Otalgia and Otitis, hearing loss, dizziness and vertigo, possible Tinnitus
 - Rhinology: Rhinitis and nasal congestion, Headache vs. Sinusitis, URI vs. Sinusitis
