COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Swineford Allergy Conference is dedicated to educating physicians involved in treating patients with disorders of allergic, pulmonary or immunologic origin.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the completion of the 53rd Annual Swineford Allergy CME conference, the participant should be able to:

- Explain the importance of biofilms in chronic inflammatory disease of the sinuses.
- Use the current information about the relevance of early oral exposure to foods to developing tolerance.
- Describe the relevance of experimental data to understanding the use of leukotriene antagonists.
- Explain the relationship between elevated serum IgE and several different forms of immunodeficiency.
- Use new information about severe asthma in developing treatment plans.
- Explain the use of genomics and gene expression in the evolution of chronic allergic disease.
- Integrate the relevance of the response of the lungs to allergens and the immune response to Rhinovirus.
- Use current information about the increasing prevalence of food allergy.
