EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The Swineford Allergy Conference is dedicated to educating physicians involved in treating patients with disorders of allergic, pulmonary or immunologic origin. At the completion of the 56th Annual Swineford Allergy conference, the participant should be able to:

- 1. Understand factors influencing the development, persistence and severity of asthma, including: a) sex hormones; b) viruses; and c) genetic variants seen in founder populations such as the Hutterites and the Amish.
- Discuss emerging topics of interest in food allergy, including: a) the role of IgG4 in disease such as mammalian meat allergy and eosinophilic esophagitis; b) novel interventions/therapeutics; and c) the potential relevance of vaccines.
- Understand the use of monoclonal antibodies in allergic disease
- Explain how tolerance develops following immunotherapy
