COURSE DESCRIPTION

Kidney transplantation is the best option to restore quality of life for patients with end stage renal disease. Current regulatory mandates require that dialysis patients receive education regarding renal transplantation and opportunity for referral to a kidney transplant center of their choosing. Through partnership with dialysis unit staff, we are able to provide a consistent message about the lifesaving benefit of kidney transplantation, the best option for kidney transplant which is living donation and what patients will encounter as a part of their evaluation.

New advances in surgical techniques have allowed for more patients to be considered appropriate for kidney transplantation. Also, expanded cadaveric donor kidney utilization has decreased wait time for patients on the UNOS Kidney Transplant Wait List. Understanding the management of patients that receive these types of transplant kidneys, empowers dialysis unit staff to more adequately support patients through their transplant experience should they require return to dialysis after their surgery.
