PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

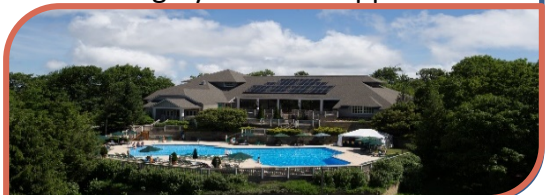
Please join us for 2019 UVA Controversies in Liver Disease and Liver Transplantation at the beautiful Wintergreen Resort. Experts in the field plan to cover topics that are highly relevant for practicing gastroenterologists, hepatologists, primary care physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and anyone involved with treating liver disease patients before and after transplantation. Discussions will include nutrition, frailty and deconditioning in the transplant patient; management of the pretransplant candidate; model end stage liver disease (MELD) and organ allocation changes; timing of transplant referrals; living donation updates; medical management of the transplant recipient; a mock selection committee and panel discussions. The program will be a half day format.



Educational Objectives

At the completion of this program, participants should be able to:

1. Use objective measures to evaluate transplant candidate frailty and deconditioning and be able to recognize interventions that may improve outcomes
2. Recognize core concepts in the evaluation and management of the decompensated cirrhosis patient as well as understand the individualized care for specific disease processes
3. Tell how changes in the organ allocation policy will affect the ability of an individual patient to be listed for liver transplantation and undergo successful transplantation
4. Discuss the indications for prompt referral for transplant evaluation while understanding limitations to early or late referrals
5. Identify the best indications for live donor liver transplant (LDLT) as well as the limitations in the LDLT system to include an overview of what the surgical procedure itself involves for the donor and recipient
6. Express the multidisciplinary approach to the liver transplant recipient and the standard of care medical management of the successful recipient
7. Describe the multifaceted approach to each liver transplant candidate and the requirements and gray zones for approval and listing for candidates
