PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This course is designed for physical therapists, pediatricians, family practice and physical medicine physicians, nurses, advance practitioners, and other professionals and individuals interested in the medical care of persons with neuromuscular conditions, including cerebral palsy (CP), spinal muscular atrophy (SMA), neuromuscular scoliosis, and other disorders. Nationally recognized clinicians and research scientists will present detailed updates on the research and clinical implications for early diagnosis and management of neuromuscular conditions. Case studies and interdisciplinary panels will provide opportunities for audience participation.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After attending the program, participants should be able to...

- Describe and advocate for better care coordination for child with neuromuscular conditions.
- Analyze the lifespan planning for children with CP to better anticipate and prepare for lifespan needs.
- Explain the needs for postural therapy and apply appropriate protocols when needed.
- Discuss the role of emerging medical treatments and benefits to children with Spinal Muscular Atrophy and Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.
- Appraise the roles of interventions for functional goals in children with Down Syndrome and other conditions with hypotonia.
